# Call to Create presents *On Mass* with Jamie Cullum at the Roundhouse Part of the EFG London Jazz Festival

International creative youth network Call to Create announce Jamie Cullum for *On Mass* – a mass music-making one off performance at the Roundhouse – as part of the EFG London Jazz Festival.

Jamie Cullum has called upon young artists from around the world to respond to an original musical passage, which will culminate in a huge performance by Jamie and the young artists at the Roundhouse in London on Sunday 15 November.

The project was born out of the Call to Create network – a network established by the Roundhouse to platform the talents of young artists and to encourage collaborations between established and emerging artists around the world.

Call to Create partners involved in the performance include Shelter+ (Ukraine), the British Council's Connect ZA programme (South Africa), South African Department of Arts & Culture, Musical Society of Nigeria (MUSON), National Orchestra For All (NOFA), Roundhouse Choir, Kinetika Bloco, the Roundhouse Music Collective and Wax Lyrical.

Over the coming month's artists from the UK will travel to Ukraine, South Africa and Nigeria to work with young musicians to create a one of a kind performance. Interpretations of Jamie Cullum's motif will be created by young musicians who will be invited back to the Roundhouse to perform in a vast showcase of young international artists. The climax will build to a live mash-up of the theme orchestrated by Roundhouse Associate Artist Tim Exile using bespoke technology created especially for the show. The event will be live streamed to a global audience.

Jamie Cullum said, "It'll be a pleasure and privilege to share the Roundhouse stage with so many talented young artists from around the world. It's so important to give young artists the platform to profile their talent as I know they'll bring their new ideas and energy to create an incredible performance. I cannot wait to hear where the artists have taken the motif I wrote especially for this collaboration."

Call to Create is a global network of over 100 arts organisations who believe it's time to shine a spotlight on the work of young creatives around the world. Through creativity and by joining together the organisations can be a louder voice to highlight the profound contribution young people make to their local communities and society at large.

Marcus Davey, chief executive and artistic director of the Roundhouse said, "This is going to be an explosive night at the Roundhouse and is everything we set out to achieve when we established the Call to Create network. We aim to produce a life changing event for the young people involved. As well as honing their musical skills, the performance will increase









their confidence and self-esteem, and expand their world view as they play jazz and roots music from around the globe, encouraging a celebration of diversity."

The Roundhouse is working in partnership with the British Council on the international collaborations within On Mass and is supporting participation of musicians and artists from Nigeria, Ukraine, and South Africa to take part.

This project has been supported by the SA-UK Seasons 2014 & 2015, a partnership between the Department of Arts and Culture, South Africa and the British Council.

Each year, the **Roundhouse** works with over 3,000 11-25s, enabling them to realise their potential through creativity. The Roundhouse aims to work with young people who have been excluded, marginalised or disadvantaged by society, aiding them to find pathways back into education, work or simply to enjoy a wider cultural life. Taking a mix of international and British artists and a commitment to education activity, the London Jazz Festival began to spread its wings.
